AMCO represents all airport and aerodromes across Ontario and has over 50 business and associate members that help to support and service the airport industry.



To fulfil our vision of leading Ontario's airports and aerodromes to be the safest and most efficient in the world AMCO offers both in-class and online training to our members.

In-class courses range from 'Obstacle Limitation Surfaces' to 'Airfield Electrical Maintenance' and everything in between. Running three or four courses per year AMCO provides opportunities for training in each of our regions to benefit the largest amount of our members possible.

AMCO uses business and associate members to provide training to maximize the face-to-face networking time our members receive.

AMCO offers web based occupational health and safety training through our online platform training.amco.on.ca. The cost is a fraction of the budget needed to send employees for off-site training and contains courses such as WHIMIS 2015, Safety Management Systems, Airside Vehicle Operators Permits and Workplace Violence and Harassment Training.

AMCO holds two major events each year hosted by our airport and aerodrome members giving them the opportunity to showcase their regions.

The **Annual Convention and Trade Show** is a time to network, collaborate, and learn from each other's collective experiences.

COMMUNICATION AND ADVOCACY

Beyond events and training AMCO provides the opportunity to connect and help shape the airport environment of the future.

AMCO helps you reach as many airports and businesses as possible to solve issues, research solutions, and tender documents or equipment through programs like an "Airport is Asking" email blast.

Members have exclusive access to our website which hosts a rich resource library, helpful SMS tools, job postings, and the AMCO directory of all our airport and business members so you can easily connect to professionals within the industry.

AMCO participates in the Canadian Aviation Regulation Advisory Council (CARAC) and the NAV CANADA Advisory Committee (NCAC) to help monitor developments within the airport industry and communicate this information to our members.

We also produce a quarterly online magazine to disseminate information, communicate developments at Ontario airports, and offer advertising opportunities to our business members. 'The Airport Environment and You' magazine currently reaches over 400 industry professionals across Canada.

It is within AMCO's mission to advocate on behalf of our members and we work hard to fulfil that goal. AMCO partners with other industry associations including the Canadian Airport Council (CAC), the Regional Community Airports of Canada (RCAC), the Atlantic Canada Airports Association (ACAA), and le Conseil des Aeroports du Quebec (CAQ) to lobby for changes that affect the airport industry in Canada.

The 'Partners for Regional Aviation Infrastructure' challenged the current Airports Capital Assistance Program and the lack of funding for small and regional airports without scheduled service. This partnership stems from AMCO's ACAP working group and is just one of the many working groups AMCO leads to help advocate for airports and aerodromes in Ontario.


